


EDUCATION

Clean water opens the door to a world of opportunities. Every \$1 invested in improved water access and sanitation yields \$4.30 in economic returns.




Why Malawi?

Malawi is one of Africa's most densely populated and least developed countries, with 66% of the population living below the income poverty line. Recent droughts and floods have devastated already under-developed water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) infrastructure, and approximately 31% of the rural population continues to lack basic access to clean drinking water. PARTNER SPOTLIGHT Our local partner Self Help Africa has worked in the Dowa District of Malawi since 2013. It's estimated that 71% of the population there have access to improved water sources but just 6% have access to improved sanitation. Salinity of the groundwater, which can affect the taste, has also led some people to abandon clean water points. Self Help Africa Malawi has created a robust water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) program that addresses these needs and encourages community involvement to ensure the long-term success of their projects.

Sustainability

Our work doesn't end when a water point is constructed. Through local leaders, innovative sensor technology, and trained mechanics, we're committed to taking care of the projects we've built and keeping clean water flowing without interruption.
