- The open house will have naloxone training and rescue kits, and COVID-19 and flu vaccines, and snacks. Facility tours, including the Mobile Medical Van, will be held on 10:30 a.m., 11:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m., 4:30 p.m., and 5:30 p.m. that day. A full schedule of activities can be found on the Clatsop County website.
- During the open house, the public may provide feedback on local health services by completing a short survey. The first 100 people who complete the survey will receive a coffee gift card. County employees are encouraged to complete the survey, but they are not eligible to receive a gift card.

"We look forward to celebrating Public Health Week with you on April 4 as one more step in Clatsop County's journey towards a culture of health and wellbeing." Huang said.

All services provided by Clatsop County Public Health Department are open to the public. Many services are no cost or low cost and no one will be denied services if they cannot pay.
