Fire training at Cheyenne Mountain Space Force Station

PETERSON SPACE FORCE BASE, Colo. – Two separate scheduled fire training exercises will take place on Cheyenne Mountain Space Force Station from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. on Sept. 23-24 and Oct. 4. These exercises are part of ongoing efforts to ensure the preparedness and safety of our personnel and the surrounding community in the event of an emergency.

During this time, residents in nearby areas may notice increased activity on the installation, including visible smoke, fire, and the presence of emergency vehicles. Please be advised that these are controlled exercises, and there is no cause for alarm. The CMSFS training center has significant safety controls in place to ensure the training environment remains safe yet provides the maximum educational environment for the firefighting teams.

This routine training is conducted to ensure emergency responders are prepared to handle a wide variety of emergencies on and off the installation in coordination with mutual aid partners.

Traffic in and around Cheyenne Mountain SFS may experience temporary disruptions, so we recommend planning accordingly. Space Base Delta 1 is committed to ensuring that all exercises are carried out with safety as the top priority, and every effort will be made to minimize inconvenience to the community.

Today, Cheyenne Mountain SFS, part of Space Base Delta 1, hosts multiple Department of Defense missions and serves as NORAD and USNORTHCOM's Alternate Command Center and as a training site for crew qualification.
