Columbia County to "Light Up Green" in Support of Veterans This November

[Oct 29, 2025] — Columbia County is proud to partner with Community Action Team and Veteran's Bunker as it joins counties across the nation in Operation Green Light — a campaign that honors veterans and highlights the resources and support available to them. From November 4 through November 11, 2025, residents, businesses, and government buildings are encouraged to "light up green" as a visible show of gratitude for those who have served in the United States Armed Forces.
